

Heinz Vetschera, LL.D, Ph.D., Brigadier General (Ret.) was born 1948.

He studied laws and political science at the University of Vienna. From 1972 to 2012, Mr. Vetschera was a researcher and instructor/lecturer at the Austrian National Defence Academy with study periods as research fellow at the International Institute for Strategic Studies (IISS), London (1980-1981), and the Institute for East-West-Security Studies, New York, (1983-1884). In 1998, he was appointed *Universitätsdozent* (adjunct professor) at Vienna University. He was guest lecturer inter alia at NATO Defense College (1986-1997), the Baltic Defence College (1999-2011) and the Geneva Centre for Security Policy (GCSP, 1999-2013). His last assignment was Academic Lecturer, Peace Support Operations Training Centre (PSOTC), Sarajevo (2007-2012); Retired since 2012.
